She is a cheerful train who always has a smile on her face.


Past a tree, under a bridge, the train leaves trams and buses in her dust.

There's no stopping her! She chugs along through the next day, taking no rests.


CLANK CLANK, the train says, smiling broadly. CLACKITY CLACK!

The train gives a terrified shout!


Out pops a little boy, smiling happily.

As he plays his tunes, she feels herself becoming a little braver.




The train dances around the boy, cheerful once again.


The boy plays all through the night. The train and all the forest animals dance for hours.





- 2. How does the boy with the magic flute help solve the train's problem?

#### **Emotions and Reactions:**

- 2. What emotions does the train experience when she feels scared in the forest?
