I can climb up the steps.




But I cannot climb back down again.

I can climb on a chair, and then on the table!




But I cannot climb down again.

- 2. What happens after the boy climbs up on the chair?

- 4. What does the boy call out to his dad when he can't climb down?

Problem and Solution:

- 1. What is the problem the boy faces after he climbs up on the chair and table?
- 2. How does the boy solve the problem of not being able to climb down?
- 3. What does the dad suggest to help the boy?

Emotions and Reactions:

- 1. How does the boy feel when he climbs up but can't climb down?
- 2. How does the dad react when the boy calls for help?
- 3. How does the boy feel when he finally climbs down by himself?
