


The race




Four friends want to have a race with their toys.

Veen has a green car.




Meena has a yellow auto.


Sanju has a red bus.



Write your own short story about a race you won.










- What do the children do before starting the race?
- What happens during the race?
- Who wins the race, and how is it decided?

3. Problem and Solution

- Is there any problem in the story? If so, what is it?
- How do the children react to the problem during the race?
- What is the solution to the problem in the race?

4. Emotions and Reactions

- How do the children feel before the race?
- What is the reaction of the children when Lucky wins the race?
- How do you think the children felt when they saw Lucky running with the vehicles?

5. Vocabulary and Language

- What does the word "race" mean in the story?
- Can you find any words that describe the vehicles in the story?
- What do you think the words "fastest" and "winner" mean?
- What other words can we use to talk about the speed of the vehicles?
